

Instructions to Prepare a Paper for the 113th EAAE Seminar

Abstract. This document provides information and instructions to prepare a paper for the 113th EAAE Seminar. Papers can be prepared using any word processing program by following the instructions below. Save the file as Microsoft Word document or as "Rich Text Format. Follow this order when typing papers: Title, Authors, Affiliations, Abstract, Keywords, Main text, Acknowledgements, References. Your abstract must not exceed 200 words.

Keywords: Food Quality Products, Production, Demand, Public Policy.

1. Introduction

This text is just a sample so it does not make very much sense, but do not worry. Just look at the style.

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1.1. More in this subsection

Quality in food production systems is becoming an issue of great importance to consumers. Demand for food quality products has increased substantially due to higher consumer education levels and availability and accessibility of better, more thorough information.

To meet consumer needs, producers nowadays are trying to apply innovative production methods that lead to higher quality and healthier food products. This however, leads to higher prices and therefore, a higher income. Organic products, traditional production methods and production linked to a specific territory satisfy this demand.

2. General specifications

2.1. Text

The paper must be written in English, A4 paper (21 x 29.7cm), single-spaced, justified, with a font size of 10pt, in Times New Roman.

2.2. Margins

The margins must be formatted to 3cm on all sides of the paper. The header must be 2cm and footers must be 1cm

2.3. Paper Length

Generally, the size of the paper should not exceed 15 printed pages including figures, tables and references.

3. Title, Authors, Affiliation, Key Words, Abstract

When typing your paper, please follow the order: Title, Author(s), Affiliation(s), Abstract, Key words, full text

3.1. Title

The title should be written centered, in 16pt, boldface Times New Roman, capitalized the fist letter. It should be single spaced if the title is more than one line.

3.2. Authors

The authors' name should include first name, middle initial and surname. It should be written centered, in 12pt Times New Roman, below the title.

3.3. Affiliation

Author's affiliation should be written centered, in 9pt, Times New Roman, below the authors' name.

3.4. Abstract

Use 9pt Italic, Times New Roman for the abstract. The word Abstract must be set in boldface at the beginning of the first line. The abstract text should be justified. The abstract must not exceed 200 words.

3.5. Keywords

Please, write no more than six key words. They should be written left aligned, in 9pt Times New Roman, and the line must begin with the words Keywords (as shown in the first page of these Instructions).

4. Headings

4.1. Main headings

The main headings should be written left aligned, in 14pt, boldface Times New Roman, with an initial capital for first word only.

4.2. Secondary headings

Secondary headings should be written left aligned, in 12pt, boldface Times New Roman, with an initial capital for first word only.

Third level heading

Third level heading should be written left aligned, in 12pt, boldface Times New Roman, with an initial capital for first word only.

5. Page numbers

Page numbers should be written centered at the bottom of the page (footer), in 10pt, Times New Roman.

6. Figures

All figures should be numbered consecutively and captioned. The caption title should be written centered, in 10pt Times New Roman, with upper and lower case letters.

Figures must be sent embedded in the document.

Figures may be included in the text or added at the end of the paper.

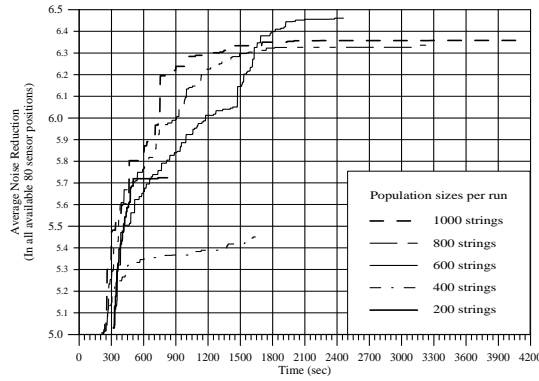


Figure 1. Example of showing of a figure

7. Equations

A displayed equation is numbered, using Arabic numbers in parentheses. It should be centered, leaving a 8pt space above and below to separate it from the surrounding text.

The following example is a single line equation:

$$Ax = b \tag{1}$$

The next example is a multi-line equation:

$$\begin{aligned} Ax &= b \\ Ax &= b \end{aligned} \tag{2}$$

8. Tables

All tables should be numbered consecutively and captioned, the caption should be 10pt Times New Roman, upper and lower case letters.

For *Proceedings*: surname, initials (year), “title”, *Title, place, date of the Conference*, Volume of the Proceedings, Pages, e.g.
